






• ZLTO, an organization of ≈18,000 farmers and horticulturalists owns the only share of VION

 The board is made up of 4 ZLTO members and 4 members from outside VION




VION – Revenue by Segment

- VION has 48 business units in Germany, I3 in the Netherlands, 49 in the United Kingdom, and more than I0 other locations across the rest of Europe.
 - 44 Fresh Meat Operating Plants

- At the end of 2010,VION employed 26,756 staff.

Recent Financial Results

- Fiscal 2010
 - Revenue of €8.87 billion (down 1.9%YOY)
 - Net Income of € 80 million (up 30%YOY)

Recent Developments

- In May 2011,VION announced the closure of 2 facilities in the Netherlands with the loss of 170 jobs.
- In July and August, VION announced the closure of 2 facilities in the UK with the loss of some 300 jobs.
